Our School

St John Bosco School opened in 1954 and continues to serve the local and broader Brooklyn Park community as a Reception to Year 6 Catholic school. Our school was administered by the Salesian Sisters from 1954 until the end of 1996. Drawing on the inspiration from Saint John Bosco and Saint Maria Mazzarello, our school's original name was Mary Help of Christians and was formally blessed and opened by Archbishop Beovich. The school was later renamed St John Bosco School.

Today, a Lay Principal leads a professional and dedicated staff, supported by Catholic Education South Australia (CESA). Our school community continues to be immersed in the spirit of the Salesians - friendship with Jesus and one another, service, joy, optimism, respect, understanding and recognising the presence of God in our lives.

Our motto, "Serve the Lord with Joy" (Psalm 100:2) reminds us of our role as Christian people and how we aim to serve others.

Pedagogy



At St John Bosco School, the child is at the centre of everything we do.

The child is viewed as a competent learner who is capable of forming decisions about their learning. Through explicit instruction and inquiry-based opportunities, we value the child's voice and the rich learning process. We use strategies that support children to enhance their own and each other's construction of knowledge and understandings.

Each teacher's flexible, yet informed planning and programming ensures they are able to adjust learning experiences to involve the wonderings and interests of the individual child. Simultaneously, educators maintain a comprehensive knowledge of the Australian Curriculum and constantly engage in current research to ensure all learners are accessing the curriculum. We balance explicit instruction with open-ended, explorative and hands-on opportunities.

We recognise that we are co-researchers and co-wonderers alongside children and continuously document and revisit learning with the children.

Each learning environment is calm and welcoming, promoting a sense of belonging. We value listening as a rich, emotional and active learning process and constantly encourage wonder and awe.



Teaching, Learning and Wellbeing

RELIGIOUS EDUCATION

Central to our identity as a Catholic School is our call to serve the Lord by living out Gospel values. Religious Education enables children to build knowledge and relationships with God and one another. Children actively explore God, Faith, Scripture and Social Justice. Children learn about social justice and service to others through daily life and in the wider community through activities for Mission Day and Project Compassion.

ENGLISH

From Reception to Year 6, children actively engage in the Playberry Laser Literacy Program. This evidence-based, multisensory program is delivered by our highly skilled teachers through explicit instruction. The comprehensive program covers the alphabet, handwriting, phonology, spelling rules, grammar concepts and morphology. To consolidate learning, the program includes daily reviews, scaffolded and independent practice, and the use of connected texts and dictations.

We also implement The Writing Revolution which is an evidence-based methodology that transforms children's writing skills. The program emphasises the importance of explicit instruction in writing, integrating it seamlessly across all curriculum areas. By focusing on sentence structure, paragraph development and the organisation of ideas, our children gain the tools they need to express themselves clearly and confidently. The Writing Revolution not only enhances the children's writing abilities but also strengthens their critical thinking and comprehension skills.

MATHEMATICS

We adopt a consistent and focused whole-school approach to teaching Mathematics and enhancing numeracy skills, aligned with the Australian Curriculum (ACARA). Our lessons are structured with 'daily reviews' to activate prior knowledge, the practice of basic number facts (automaticity) and the explicit teaching of new concepts and skills. Children are provided with various opportunities to apply, transfer, and reflect on their mathematical learning, ensuring a comprehensive understanding and mastery of mathematical concepts and processes.

INQUIRY

Our teachers use their extensive knowledge of the Australian Curriculum to create engaging inquiry-based learning experiences in subjects such as HASS (Humanities and Social Sciences), Health and Religious Education. We strive to nurture a sense of wonder, curiosity and respect in our children, fostering an interest in diverse places, people and cultures around the world.

WELLBEING

The fostering and development of wellbeing is embedded into everything we do at St John Bosco School and lies at the heart of excellent pedagogy. Our learning programs are underpinned by evidence-based wellbeing practices that affirm our belief that all children are competent and capable learners.

Each child's holistic growth and wellbeing is embraced, and they are encouraged to build confidence and resilience along with strategies to develop skills in emotional regulation.

SPECIALIST LESSONS

JAPANESE

The language strand of the Australian Curriculum enables all children to explore a Language Other Than English. At St John Bosco, we feel fortunate to be blessed with such a rich and culturally diverse community. From Reception, the children are immersed in our Japanese program where they investigate, explore and experience aspects of Japanese culture and language.

PHYSICAL EDUCATION

Children explore personal, social and community health as well as movement and physical activity. Each class has two x 45 minute lessons weekly with a specialist Physical Education Teacher.

PERFORMING ARTS

Children are taught Music, Dance and Drama with a specialist Performing Arts Teacher. Although these art forms have close relationships and are often used in interrelated ways, each involves different knowledge, understanding and creative skills.

STEM

(Science, Technology, Engineering & Mathematics)

Science and Technologies are taught by our specialist STEM Teacher. These lessons are inquiry-based and involve investigations in which children are encouraged to explore, experiment and discover.

Assessment and Reporting

At St John Bosco School, we believe that assessment and reporting are integral to the learning journey of each child. Our approach is designed to provide a comprehensive understanding of your child's progress, strengths and areas for growth, ensuring they receive the guidance they need to thrive.

We welcome open, ongoing conversations about your child's progress, growth and achievements. A variety of assessment methods are used to gain a comprehensive view of your child's learning. These include formative assessments, which are ongoing and provide immediate feedback to guide instruction and summative assessments to evaluate children's learning at the end of a unit or term. Our assessments are aligned with the Australian Curriculum and are designed to be fair, inclusive, and reflective of each child's unique abilities and learning style.

DATA TRACKING

Each child's assessment data is tracked and recorded on a data wall. This visual tool allows teachers to monitor progress over time, identify trends and adjust teaching strategies to meet the individual needs of each child. By using the data wall, our teachers ensure their teaching strategies are responsive and meet the developing needs of each child's learning journey.

LEARNING CONVERSATIONS

Formal Learning Conversations with families are offered in Term 1 and again in Terms 2 and 4. Learning Conversations provide an opportunity for parents and teachers to discuss the child's progress and set goals for future learning.

WRITTEN REPORTS

Formal written Reports are provided at the end of Terms 2 and 4. Reports provide detailed insights into academic achievement, effort, and personal development.





By maintaining open lines of communication and providing meaningful feedback, we aim to create a supportive and collaborative environment where every child can achieve their full potential.

Opportunities and Experiences

DIGITAL TECHNOLOGY

Technology has become a big part of our lives. At our school, children are equipped with ICT tools to enhance their learning. Early Years children (R-2) have access to an iPad and our Primary Years children (Years 3-6) are provided with laptops and iPads to utilise at school.

INSTRUMENTAL MUSIC PROGRAM

Learning a musical instrument is a wonderful experience. Music Tutors from *Learning Through Music* currently support children to learn Drums, Guitar, Piano and Voice. An instrumental recital is arranged to celebrate their learning at our annual Soiree. Parents are able to arrange lessons by completing paperwork available from the Front Office and fees apply.

SPORTS

There are many opportunities for children to participate in interschool competitions, after school sports and competitive sports. After school sports on offer include Netball, Basketball, Soccer and Auskick. Children can participate in a variety of other sports and interschool competitions such as Swimming, Cross Country, Touch Football and Athletics.

WATER SAFETY AND SWIMMING

Children participate in a Water Safety Program each year at a local swimming facility. This program caters for all abilities and teaches children valuable skills for keeping safe in and around water.



LEARNING SUPPORT

We are an inclusive school and understand that individual learning needs do vary. Children ongoing classroom support receive differentiated learning from teachers Education Support Officers (ESOs) as needs are identified. We also offer additional learning support in the form of targeted Literacy Intervention in our Tier 2 and Tier 3 Programs. We have an Inclusive Education Coordinator who works in partnership with families, teachers and Allied Health Professionals. Our EALD Teacher helps create an inclusive educational environment that supports the diverse needs of children learning English as an additional language.

LEADERSHIP

At St John Bosco School we nurture leadership skills in all our children. We have a Student Voice committee, with representatives from each class that gather regularly to plan initiatives and events for their peers. The children have many opportunities to lead Assemblies and be actively involved in our Liturgies and Masses. Year 6 children have the opportunity to nominate themselves to be a House Captain or Fitness Leader.

Engaging Environments

OUTDOORS

Your child will delight in our outdoor areas. We are very fortunate to have a beautiful and purpose-built central courtyard as a feature of our school (completed in 2025). We also have an expansive grassed oval and a nature play space developed with rocks, trees and a sandpit to provoke children's creativity and imagination. Additionally, children have access to a playground, ball courts and a cricket pitch. The natural environment is embedded into our learning programs - fostering understanding and appreciation of Creation, sustainability and Earth's precious resources.

INDOORS

Our classrooms are welcoming, contemporary spaces that ignite children's learning. The children have access to resources, learning tools, digital technologies and collaborative spaces that complement the process of learning.

HALL

Built in 2024, our spacious and bright Hall plays host to a variety of school activities. Assemblies, Liturgies, performances, OSHC activities, exhibitions and PE lessons in inclement weather all occur in this beautiful modern space.

LIBRARY

Our Library beams with natural light and open space. It invites children in, to explore a range of literature and reference resources for enjoyment and research.









Beginning School

LITTLE BOSCOS

Little Boscos is our transition program that runs for two terms prior to children starting school in Reception. It assists our pre-school children on their path into school life. Little Boscos enables children and their families to meet teachers, peers and other families embarking on the same journey. This is a valuable and exciting opportunity for children to become familiar with the learning environment and form connections amongst the community. We look forward to walking alongside the children as they begin their learning journey at St John Bosco School.

Children beginning school in Term 1 can attend Little Boscos in Terms 3 and 4 of the previous year. Children beginning school mid-year in Term 3 can attend Little Boscos in Terms 1 and 2.

When can children start school in Reception?

If your child turns 5 before April 30, they are eligible and welcome to begin school in Term 1 of that year. If your child turns 5 between April 30 and October 30, they are eligible and welcome to begin school in Term 3.
