^{17.10.20} Stem in the Senior Unit

STEM is an important aspect of student learning as jobs in the future will require digital skills, how to problem solve, be innovative and to think creatively. STEM lessons provide opportunities to learn these skills which will enable them to adapt to our rapidly changing world as they learn to be flexible, work collaboratively and to think critically.

In the senior unit during rotation lessons, students are provided with an inquiry question and need to identify the problem/challenge. They use the design & engineering process to generate a range of possible solutions to the problem, which can be tested, improved and evaluated. The senior unit students have been working on a range of challenges throughout the year. They are currently working with the Lego Mindstorms EV3 Robotics kits. These kits allow students to bring their robot designs to life and program them to move, talk and think by using block coding. The possibilities are endless and students will only be limited by their own imagination.
